

This years Regional Rally will be a Rally by the Rivers to be held in beautiful, historic St. Charles, Missouri!

Our committee is busy planning a great event for attendees at this first-ever Regional Rally in the state of Missouri. We expect to have three fun-filled days of great rides on crooked roads along the rivers, through the valleys and beside the bluffs. Many other exciting events are also being planned, such as: Early Bird Welcome Party at St. Charles Harley Davidson, police bike demos, Bike Night at St. Charles Harley Davidson, a Street Party in downtown St. Charles and we'll close out the Rally with a Party in the Park alongside the Missouri River. The Wall of Death will be at St. Charles Harley Davidson for the duration of the Rally. For those not familiar, it's a barrel shaped cylinder made of wooden planks in which professional motorcyclists travel along the vertical wall and perform stunts, held in place only by friction and centrifugal force!

And rides, we'll have lots of rides! Ride Coordinator Joe Bilodeau and his team are preparing over 35 rides from which to choose, both guided and self-guided. These rides will take you on both sides of the Mississippi, along the Missouri and Illinois Rivers, so, truly a Rally by the Rivers! Rides will be available to the World- Famous St. Louis Arch, America's Wall, which is an exact replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in our nation's Capitol, and to many of our favorite spots in the area.

Please remember to bring your chapter flag for a Parade of Flags. The Mayor of St. Charles plans to lead the parade on his Road King!

For right now, the dealership is still having issues with their phone system and our Hotline is still down. (Has been since September). For now, PLEASE use the <u>ride calendar</u> for the most up to date information for any and all rides, whether its for planning, updates and/or cancelations.

I am happy to welcome 6 new trainee's and thank them for stepping up and volunteering to become Road Captains. It is appreciated and is a great way to give back to the chapter. If they all complete the process this year, we will end this year with 28 RC's, which is great. That means more rides on the calendar and more diversity of the types of rides, which we will all benefit from and enjoy. Welcome again and thank you all.

As we start looking to the riding season, please remember to sign-up for our chapter Mileage Contest and the Harley Ride365. To check if you are already signed up for our contest, check on our <u>website</u>. Remember our contest is one check-in per year, so if you are already signed up, you will check out at our October meeting and that ends up being your starting mileage for 2024. Ride365, you need two check-ins each year at the minimum. One to start and one to end within the calendar year (Jan 1 - Dec 31) and you do that one at the dealership ONLY. You can check-in more often to either update your progress or possibly register that you have crossed a milestone to get your next mileage rocker from H.O.G..

Lastly, some of you are like me and don't put your bikes in storage, hoping for those few nice riding days throughout the winter. Please remember to check over you bike thoroughly, before you pull out. Your bike has been sitting for weeks or maybe even months. Check your brakes, lights and definitely, your tire pressure. You don't want to make a turn and discover that you are having control issues or try to stop and can't. Just take those extra couple of minutes to be sure your hog is ready to ride and get you back home safely. I'll see you on the road... (maybe;—)

Some of us choose to wear a helmet for various reasons like crash protection, road noise protection, rain visibility, and if you're like me, to protect my bald-ass head from sunburn. Most people think that if a helmet has a DOT sticker on the back you're good to go. That's not necessarily the case. Did you ever wonder what the meaning behind that sticker is? Or, what about the other helmet safety stickers like Snell or ECE/FIM? I thought it might be interesting to give a brief overview between the differences in these ratings.

The first, and most prevalent, is DOT which stands for the Department of Transportation. The sticker actually refers to government helmet test standard FMVS 218 which was originally created in 1974 and based on public road automobile accident data. In a nutshell, the test consists of hitting the helmet with both spherical and flat anvils at a specific load at specific locations on the helmet. The standard is based on the honor system. In other words, it's up to the helmet manufacturer to test the helmet and declare if it passes. Face shields and helmet strap testing is not required. There are several issues worth noting here. First, the manufacture can design the helmet to pass since the locations of impact are spelled out in the test procedure, so they can cut material cost in the untested areas of the helmet. Second, manufactures have been routinely caught cheating by lying about a successful pass. The last audit done in 2006 by the DOT found 18 out of 40 samples from various manufacturers failed. Also worth noting is that the manufacturer can sell the helmet prior to testing!

The second rating that you will come across is the Snell Foundation, usually associated with more expensive helmets. In order to achieve Snell certification, the helmet must be tested by an independent lab, which will also audit helmets by going out into the marketplace and purchasing them for testing. Therefore, Snell certification tends to be expensive which is part of the reason for the higher helmet cost; the other is the cost of construction to meet the certification requirements. Similar to DOT testing, the helmet is impacted with both spherical and flat anvils, and an additional edge type anvil (to simulate a curb impact). Also, unlike DOT, the Snell cert requires two impacts at each random location instead of a single impact. In addition, the test also includes shell abrasion, visor impact and chin strap tests. It's worth noting that to date no modular helmets or helmets with drop down visors have Snell certification.

There is a third helmet certification, the European ECE/FIM. Suffice it to say it falls somewhere between DOT and Snell.

I felt it was important to show the differences between the two most common certifications found in the U.S. to help anyone who is thinking about purchasing a helmet. The bottom line is that you get what you pay for when it comes to helmet construction.





Well hello again to everyone! You all got lucky and had an entire year off from reading my articles lol. As the new editor I am always open to new ideas or suggestions. One thing I would like to do each month is a membership showcase page, so if you would like to share stories from an awesome trip or ride or just want to share your personal H.O.G. story with other members please feel free to send me an email. I will start off with a bit of an example using my own experiences.

Member Highlight Corey Johnston

Lake Shore H.O.G. member since 2014. My first Harley was a used 2007 road king classic since then I have owned a 2016 road glide ultra and my current 2018 road glide ultra "Thunderbird" she has just under 80,000 miles on her so she isn't broken in quite yet. I have served the chapter as Activities officer, Director for four years, Road Captain for five years, and now editor. I would say I am passionate about riding Harley-Davidson motorcycles and I love sharing that with others. I get great joy out of leading rides and planning trips for others to enjoy. My road name Is Rain Man, in 2016 I received the name from friends because every trip I took it rained, I kept track that season I rode over 5,000 miles in the rain. Words of advice buy a good rain suit. Those that know me know that I have a thing for endurance riding and pushing my personal riding limits. This is not for everyone but I love Iron Butt rides. My first official one was a ride to Nashville for lunch and back home the same day, 1061 miles in 19 hours. I have ridden around Lake Michigan in , less than 24 hours twice. One of my favorite years of travel was 2020. I set out on a Monday morning from my home in Waukegan and ended my day in Western Montana traveling 1500 miles in under 30 hours. The next day I traveled across beautiful Idaho and Washington through the cascade mountains to Bremerton Washington, West of Seattle, traveling over 2000 miles in under 48 hours. Day three I traveled the Olympic peninsula stopping the North Westernmost point in the contiguous US. I continued down the pacific coast highway through Oregon and was forced to turn east due to wildfires in California. I traveled through the mountains and high deserts of Nevada, through the salt flats of Utah, through Wyoming, Nebraska, and Iowa. I camped out in rest areas two of the nights. By the end of the trip I had traveled about 6,000 miles and 12 states in 7 days. I brought my bike home for service and a week of work before setting out again. I then road with my father and Doug Wrobel to the East Coast down the Mountains of Virginia, through the Carolinas and Georgia on to Florida. We rode to Key West were I took a photo at the South Easternmost point of the US. I was so excited to have ridden coast to coast in less than three weeks, including an off week. I feel very blessed to be able to share the road with so many interesting people and to be able to say at the age of 37 that I have ridden over 130,000 miles on a Harley Davidson, all across this gorgeous country. If you are interested in long distance or endurance riding or need help planning your next trip please don't hesitate to say hey. I would be happy to give my personal tips.
