

We'll do our best to get it on the calendar.

The dealership is still having issues with their phone system, so no more Hotline, it is permanently down. Just use the <u>ride calendar</u> on our website for the most up to date information for any and all rides, whether its for planning, updates and/or cancelations.

I am happy to welcome a new trainee to becoming a Road Captain and thank him for stepping up to do this for the chapter. I'd love to see a few more volunteers, it really is very rewarding and a great way to give back to the chapter. If you are having second thoughts about becoming an RC and might want to consider becoming one, you can contact me (info below) by our February 19th meeting. That has to be the cut-off, because that is when we start the training. This is a great way to do something for your brothers and sisters in the chapter and have fun doing it, while riding... Who could ask for more...;—)

As we start looking to the riding season, please remember to sign-up for our chapter Mileage Contest and the Harley Ride365. To check if you are already signed up for our contest, check on our <u>website</u>. Remember, our contest is one check-in per year, so if you are already signed up, you

will check out at our October meeting and that ends up being your starting mileage for 2025.

Ride365, you need two check-ins each year at the minimum. One to start and one to end within the calendar year (Jan 1 - Dec 31) and you do that one at the dealership ONLY. You can check-in more often to either update your progress or possibly register that you have crossed a milestone to get your next mileage rocker from H.O.G. Don't forget Harley gives you \$50 and \$100 rewards for riding 2,500 and 10,000 miles in one calendar year. So you can ride AND make money.

Lastly, some of you are like me and don't put your bikes in storage, hoping for those few nice riding days throughout the winter. Just a reminder like I did last year, please remember to check over your bike thoroughly, before you pull it out. Your bike has been sitting for weeks and/or maybe even months. Please check your brakes, lights and definitely, your tire pressure. You don't want to make a turn and discover that you are having control issues or try to stop and can't. Just take those extra couple of minutes to be sure your hog is ready to ride and get you back home safely. I'll see you on the road... (maybe;—)

Hi again...

Where we left off last month, my son Jeffrey Daniel (JD) was injured during the birth process, and I was left without a bike - and with little hope of getting one again.

Over the years as JD grew, I and those around me with similar kids tried a LOT of things to try and 'normalize' really bad situations. Some things worked. Others weren't so good.

A bunch of us had model trains and built switches so our kids could run them by just pressing their heads back in their headrests on their wheelchairs. Others created ingenious ways of accomplishing a variety of fun things for our kids to do - around their limitations. Wheelchair soccer was a bit of a bust - literally - as we build 'cow catchers' on the front of manual chairs and we pushed our kids around in the games trying to score. The repairs to the chairs (and sometimes the kids) were something to observe, as the games could get quite rough.

Over the years, without a motorcycle, I still kept up with what was going on in that world dreaming of one day returning to riding, somehow with my son. The problems with that really came down to two things. I needed a sidecar that was modified for holding a wheelchair kid. And I needed a bike that was not going to leave is stranded by the side of the road. One of those problems was solved by Harley Davidson with the development of the Evolution engine - also known as E2, EVO and even Blockhead.

What made this engine so wonderful (some say it saved H-D from the post AMF debacle by saving the company's image, which at the time was, Ummmm..., well, shit), was that it simple, light, tight and it worked.

It was introduced in 1984 as a 1,340 cc (82 <u>cu.in</u>.) motor with aluminum heads and cylinders, a single cam with overhead valve with 4 individual cam shafts. Starting in the FXR4 big twin models (including FXR2 and FXR3 - the first CVO's), simple modifications depending on bike model allowed for a E2 to be sized for the Sportster, which had a unit design pretty much unchanged from its inception in 1952. Starting with a 1,100 cc (67cu) ((and then a 1,200 cc (73cu)) and an 883 cc (53.9 cu) for the Sportster models, the E2 replaced the heavier and less reliable ironhead engine.

The Evolution Big Twin had a 15 year run - plenty of enough time for my brain to start working again - and set some plans for Jeffrey and myself.

While at therapy one day down at Chicago Rush Clinic, I pushed Jeffrey past a beautiful H-D bagger with and equally beautiful side car rig attached. I automatically started trying to figure out how I would make that work for him, even though getting a Harley, let alone a BIG Harley, still wasn't on my radar.

Turns out, Jeff's therapist was the owner - and better yet, his dad had gone through several modifications to his bike as he aged. Slightly downsizing was the first step. That was followed by a sidecar, and then a trike conversion, then a full blown trike. I admitted my desire to get something for my son - and the therapist mentioned they had an old WWII Velorex sidecar sitting around in their shop - part of an earlier attempt to keep their dad riding. After some careful and guarded conversation - I was able to 'talk him into' selling me the sidecar for a fraction of what it would have cost me on the open market.

Now all I needed was a bike.


