
One last note, remember this month is our picnic on July 18th and if you have not been to one of our picnics, you definitely don't want to miss it. Please contact Corey. To see you all there.

Howdy everyone,



Quite often, I get asked how I know so many pretty roads around here and up north. I have to admit that when I joined the chapter in 2002, I was clueless and I was amazed when I went on chapter rides and saw many great roads and routes going on our chapter rides. When I asked the RC's back then, how they knew so many routes/roads, they all answered the same. It comes with time and riding. The more you do, the more you learn and remember. One of the best things that helped me expand my knowledge of routes, roads and lo-

cales came from experimenting. Whenever we would finish I ride, no matter where it was, on my way home I came across a road that I hadn't been on before and I'd take it until it joined up with a road that I knew. This was how I continued to expand my mental map of many different areas. Then I would have one area that I would find a connecting road to another area and it then turned into one bigger area of many beautiful ride potentials. Give it a try. I've even gone out on evening rides with Sammie and we intentionally do the same thing, turning down roads we hadn't been on. One night we left our house to get pizza. 3 1/2 hours later, we where in Harvard (110 miles later) had a great dinner and then spent 2 hours getting home. It was great...

And something to keep in mind, when you are out and about looking for those wonderful backroads. Interstate, U.S. routes and state routes are unique. You will only get one Rt #45 in Illinois, Wisconsin, etc. It confuses people, when they are dealing with County signs. I've had people in my group say "Oh, I know where I am. That's County C". I smile and ask, "and what county are you in?". I get that look of I don't know. In Wisconsin, there are 72 counties. You can be sure that many, MANY of them have a County C. And a County H and County ZZ, etc. As you discover these roads, remember to connect them (in your mental map) to some road that is unique like a Rt #83 or #45 or #50. Then you will always know where you are and you can expand your mental map even more. It's fun to get lost and a great feeling when you figure out where you are and how to get back. So go and explore all you want, just GET OFF of the major roads and highways. Look for those backroads with scenery and twisties... You'll LOVE IT!

Doug Wrobel—Safety Officer



Well, hello everyone. Hard to believe that it is July already, the first half of the year seemed to fly by. Now that it's summertime, we start to think about those long trips, whether it's on our own or as a trip with friends. We all need to look ahead and plan for these rides. Check your bike out using the TCLOCK Check list. Check long range weather reports so you can plan on clothing needs.

Tips for a Safe Ride

Whether it's a quick trip to the corner market for a few things, or a two-week touring trip with friends, there are plenty of things you can do to ensure your motorcycle driving is safe and enjoyable.

It would be nice if the road was always smooth, and without bumps, but those bumps, potholes, breakdowns, lost riding moments and more are out there. The best way to avoid trouble from these instances is to be prepared. You can also improve your own safety, as well as that of your passenger's and vehicle, by not only following the laws and rules of the road, but also by knowing them well and always practicing courteous and calm driving.

Safe From the Start

The best way to start off right and ensure you have a smooth ride, and to anticipate problems that may occur is to prepare and pack for your trip, bringing water, extra clothing, a map of the area you're driving, or other items that might be necessary, depending on your trip. You should also be sure you have some safety basics, particularly a first-aid kit, and a charged mobile phone if possible.

It is also important to make sure that your bike is well-maintained and checked, and that all fluids and major systems, including braking and lights, are in working order. You cannot predict and prevent all vehicle failures and breakdowns, but you can reduce the risk by maintaining your motorcycle.

Next, you will need to make sure that you, as the driver, and any passengers are properly seated on the bike. This means sitting squarely on the center of the seat with feet on the foot pegs and hands holding handlebars or the rider. Also, make sure you and passengers are always wearing protective helmets. It may not be the law in every state, but it is common sense for safety.

Defensive Driving

One of the most obvious things you can do to make sure your driving is safe is to practice defensive driving. This does not mean you have to drive extra slow, but you should use extra caution at all times, and remember that other vehicles are not just other cars and trucks, they are people. Defensive driving consists of a few basic driving tips that are intended to help keep you focused on the road, raise your awareness of your surroundings, and prepare you for a fast reaction to avoid a crash.

A List of Defensive and Safe Driving Skills and Practices

- Avoid distractions, including mobile phones and other devices, which can divert your attention, even with hands-free functionality.
- Aim high when looking out over the handlebars at the road.
- Keep your eyes moving, meaning don't just stare at the road ahead; check mirrors and other views frequently.
- Leave yourself an out; this means anticipating what would happen if you had to swerve or slam on the brakes.
- Position both hands firmly but comfortably on handlebars.
- Never drive while feeling drowsy or sleepy; pull over at a rest stop or other safe place to take a break and get some real rest.

Courtesy is Cool

It is easy to get caught up in rushing yourself, as well as other motorists, when riding. It is important to remember that although you may be late, or another driver may have cut you off or otherwise disregarded the rules of the road, riding is no race or competition.

One of the biggest causes of accidents is vehicles following each other too close. The general rule of thumb for driving is one car-length, but it never hurts to extend the buffer between yourself and the vehicle or vehicles in front of you, especially on a motorcycle. This can also help you maintain a smoother ride that saves fuel and wear and tear on your bike. If you are spinning out every start and constantly hitting the brakes, you are accelerating too fast and following too close.

Courteous driving also consists of allowing other motorists to merge into traffic by giving them the space to do so. Similarly, if you are merging, maintain a safe speed, but do your best to quickly ccelerate to the flow of traffic.


