Hello from membership!

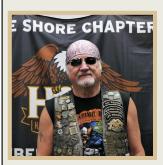

Howdy Lake Shore H.O.G.,

Since we are all cooped right now, I thought I'd share a story from about 17 years ago. I've been around this chapter since 2002 and having become an excessive rider (to put it mildly) because of all the people I've met along the way in this chapter and in the riding community at large. But before joining this chapter and buying my 1st Harley, I was a 500 to 1,000 mile a year rider at best. I rode every type of metric bike imaginable and never was much into group riding or charity rides/ events. Though I admit that my friends took me to Little Angles in 2000 and 2001. I loved everything about these types of events. The proceeds from the fee, raffles, silent auctions, 50/50 all going to the charity. Meeting new people, sharing food with them, listening to music, toasting a few and having a ball. These things intrigued me and I noticed that 85% of the people attending these

events rode Harleys. So I rode one and was sold on the bike. Bought a Softtail Springer and rode more than I use to, but still not totally hooked. Until my 1st Toys for Tots Ride... After that ride in 2003, I was in hook, line and sinker. I wrote an article for our newsletter about that experience. I'd like to share it with you and I can honestly say that events like our Bike Blessing and doing Toys for Tots STILL give me the greatest feeling in the world that I wouldn't have today, if not for biking and the brothers and sisters I've met along the way. My 2nd family forever...

Toys for Tots - Dec. 7th, 2003 - by John Sweeney

For four years I have wanted to go on the Toys for Tots charity run in Chicago. Two of those years, my band played the night before and when you get in at 4 to 5 am, you don't really want to get up 2 hours later to start riding. The other 2 years where just TOO cold. I live in Hoffman Estates, so I have about a 40 to 50 minute ride just to get to the starting point at 83rd and Western, If I remember the wind chill on those days, it was below zero. Needless to say, "I didn't go".

Well this year things where looking up. The forecast was for a high of about 40, so I figured the morning wouldn't be too cold and I would finally get to make the run. Well then Friday is SNOWED. So I thought, "here we go again!" Well then it started melting the next day, but I was sure there would be too much salt EVERYWHERE and I've spent way too much money on chrome to go out riding in heavy salt. But it melted and the melting washed away what little salt was out, so I was set to finally make the run.

I got up at 7am and the temperature was 28, I cleaned the bike one more time and put on about 5 layers of clothes and leather. One of my best purchases was a leather bandana/face mask. I left just before 8am and headed for the Southside. Going south on Rte #53 I had people looking at me like YOUR NUTS! Then eastbound on #290 I saw a bike, then another and a mile or so later another. When I turned south on #294, I joined up with about 20 bikes. We caught up to another 10 and shortly after that, a group of about 15 caught up with us. Doing 70 mph at 8:30 in the morning when its 28 degrees out sure WOKE ME UP. That facemask REALLY saved me and I actual was enjoying the ride. It was brisk, but fun and riding in a pack on Dec. 7th was cool (okay cold, but still nice). By the time we got to 95th street there were about 50 of us, which we soon joined up with 20 more on 95th and about 15 more came up from behind. When we turned north on Western allI could see where motorcycles. Every bike imaginable was there from Harleys to rice burners, 3-wheelers to WWII antiques w/sidecars. YES, even a few Boss Hogs (God I hate those things). Once we crossed 87th street, everything came to a dead halt. We where 8 bikes across, solid from 87th up to 83rd the entrance into Dan Ryan Woods just parked on Western Avenue. The bikes where backing up behind us, as far as the eye could see. It took starting up, crawling and stopping 4 times and slow moving just to getting into the woods. I had arrived at 9:10.

As I came into Dan Ryan Woods, I saw Santa's ride, which was the lead bike of the parade. It was all decked out as a sleigh and ready to leave at the 9:30 start. After getting staged I went and purchased my pin and T-shirt, then hung out and waited in the staging area with the constant, loud sound of rumbling bikes (just like all over Milwaukee for the 100th) until my group (the 4th) left at about 10:35 for the long ride up Western. I could not believe how many people where standing along the sides of Western Ave the whole length of the parade route. Stand on the curbs, sitting in chairs, holding up signs, waving flags, standing in the middle of the street giving high-fives to the passing bikes. Just a constant stream of motorcycles roaring up the street and people everywhere. It was awesome to see. A left at Foster Ave. and about a mile ride to the Fourth Division Marine Corps Center and the parade was over. Once inside it was just a sea of bikes and people and semi-trailers where you could drop off your toys. It was just one huge party.

Though final estimates aren't completed, it is said that this was the largest parade yet. Well over 35,000 bikes and possibly as many as 40,000 where in attendance. Plus over 100,000 toys where donated. All in all, it was a great experience, one that I hope to repeat time and time again. SIGN-UP FORM

This is what it is...

This is our version of the HD's mileage program. This is for our chapter members ONLY! Unfortunately, this contest is for riders, not passengers. The contest will be running annually. Your check in for the end of the yearly contest will be at our October meeting. Winners will be announced at our February meeting. This check in will be your starting mileage for next years contest. If you miss the check-in, still get your mileage recorded, so you are set for the next year. All you have to do is fill out this form and have it endorsed by one of our officers (listed on our website) or sign-up in the service department at Lake Shore, THEN RIDE! To finish the contest, just have an officer verify your final mileage or check back in at the dealership. We have three categories for this event. "The Weekend Warrior", "Iron Butt" and the "Retired".

The "Iron Butt" is pretty straight forward. These are the riders that get out weekdays, weekends, long weekends, long trips, etc. They rack up the miles, so its whomever rides the most in the allotted timeframe will win.

"Weekend Warriors" are more of our less frequent riders. This is not to say you only ride on weekends, but for the most part, you work all week , so your riding time is limited. Even if you ride to and from work but its 5/10 miles that would only be about 100 miles a week, so this would still be a good category for that type of rider. The caveat will be that, if you enter the "Weekend Warrior" category and your total miles exceed the curve, you will be moved to the "Iron Butt" category automatically. The curve will be 30% of the average of the total miles of the entire Weekend Warrior participants. That 30% will be added to the average and that becomes the ceiling for the Weekend Warriors category. If your mileage exceeds that number, you then are in the Iron Butt category.

Cash prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd place in each division. Also 1st, 2nd & 3rd place in each division with have their names on display at the dealer. Though we are allowing members to register more than one bike in the contest, each bike must be registered separately. ONE BIKE PER SHEET. Mileage for each bike will be totaled together for the prizes and patch/rockers.

"Retired" just what it says. Join this if you would like, but if you are retired and do over 10,000 miles you will be moved into the category... automatically...

"In Addition..." if you hit 5,000 miles you will receive a main patch (1st year only) and the yearly rocker, plus your name will be on display at the dealership. All following years you will receive that years rocker. You MUST check in to win prizes and/or get your patch and/or rocker. Your ending mileage will become your starting

mileage for the next year. I f you do not reading for the next year when you do cl	check in by the October meeting, you will start a new mileage heck in.
