
# Nita Cruz & Sammie Sweeney Activities



#### **Tales From the Trail**

Many of my travels over the years have been solo trips, but some of the best and most memorable trips are with family and friends. In 2019 I organized a friends trip to the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. Planning a group trip can be stressful but also very rewarding when you see everyone enjoy themselves. We started off with breakfast at The Point before hitting the road. In total there were 14 of us traveling together. We had one heck of a convoy two vehicles with trailers one tail car and six bikes for the first two days. We traveled to Blue Earth, MN on our first day. This happens to be the home of the 8000 pound, 55 foot tall Jolly Green Giant, you know we had to get a group shot before leaving town. Our second day saw us traveling into South Dakota, we stopped at the Dignity Statue along the route. We of course had to hit rain before making it to our destination, a quick pull off to put on rain suits and we were back on the road. On Sunday afternoon we arrived at the Custer State Game Lodge and Cabins. Part of our group was staying in the lodge and we also rented three cabins. It was a great location in the Custer State Park directly between Needles Highway and Iron Mountain Road. There is a general store next to the cabins for basic needs. I would highly recommend staying here. We quickly checked in and Heather and I and two others rode an additional 100 miles one way to the Oglala Lakota Pine Ridge Reservation for their annual Pow Wow. What an experience. When we arrived we found that the mile long dirt track around the Pow Wow grounds had been turned to a mile of mud, ugh. We asked the ladies to dismount, we navigated the course with less weight.


We made it around the track after finally deciding to ride through grass. We had a great time, watching the dancers, eating, and looking at crafts, until on our way along the 100 miles return trip we got caught in a popup thunderstorm in the middle of nowhere in the middle of the night. The next morning the entire group reconvened with the addition of my father and brother who rode out to meet us. All the bikes were unloaded from the trailers and I lead 11 bikes to Sturgis were we walked the streets and had a lunch break, we then continued to Spearfish and road the famous Spearfish Canyon. We rode on to historic Deadwood where we stopped at the famous Trevino's Leathers and then continued through the Black Hills through Hill City and on to Custer where we stopped for dinner. On Tuesday we braved the heat and stopped at Black Hills Harley where Patrick almost decided to trade for a "smaller bike". We then made our way to the Badlands and rode the scenic loop. On Wednesday we took in the sites riding up Iron Mountain that begins just a mile from our cabin and stopped at Mt Rushmore then to Crazy horse. We finished our day by riding the one and only Needles Highway that ends only two miles from the cabin. That night we gathered round the fire and had steaks and celebrated Patrick's 70th birthday a memorable night when he received the gift of his Life membership. On Thursday we made the long trek to Devils Tower and Hulett, WY. We ended the day with a trip through the wildlife loop viewing buffalo and stopping at the Blue Bell Lodge for dinner. On Friday we started the long journey home our first day was windy and a very long 555 miles to Albert Lea, MN. On Saturday we started the day off in you guessed it 135 miles of rain. The group split ways over Friday and Saturday and by the end of the 135 miles of rain just four bikes continued on for Illinois. We all made it home safely. I fondly remember our nights around the fire filled with drinks, laughter, cigars and smiles. Memories that will last a lifetime. So if you have the chance to travel with family and friends don't pass up the opportunity.





